

Cloistered Three-Year Retreat

Three-year, three-month retreats are a tradition in the Karma and Shangpa Kagyu lineages. Such retreats require cloistered areas, one for men and one for women. The course of study is structured, rigorous, and engaging, covering topics in Tibetan philosophy and yoga. Those chosen to do this are given the title of *lama* at the completion of the retreat. Below is the cloistered three-year retreat center for men--Naro Ling. Here David Curtis completed the retreat in 1992.
